

## Evaluating digital sources

Use this checklist when assessing the appropriateness of sources for your assignment.

### Currency

- When was the page/website last updated?
- How much does the publication date matter in the context of your use?

### Relevance

- How is this content relevant to your assignment?
- Does this information relate to the research questions that you want to address?
- Will it make a positive contribution and strengthen the arguments that you make?

### Authority

- To what degree does the author have expertise in the topic?
- Does the material go through editorial/peer checks?
- What further research can you do to validate who the author is and their credentials?

### Accuracy

- Is the text generally free from spelling, grammar and formatting errors?
- Is the origin of the information made clear?
- Does the author supply references and evidence to support statements that are not self-evident/well-known?

### Purpose

- What are the reasons that underline the creation of this source/information: is it primarily to inform, inspire, sell, persuade, or entertain?
- Who is the intended audience for this information?

### Objectivity

- Does the material promote any personal opinions or agendas?
- Is the text primarily evidence-based, or opinion-based?
